Hard to believe, but 2020 is coming up fast. Tickets for our December 10 Holiday lunch will go on sale at our next lunch meeting (October 8), at which time we will also begin collecting our annual



dues for the coming year. Both amounts are unchanged from previous years - \$25 for the Holiday lunch, \$20 for our dues.

We continue to have a problem with members failing to inform our Attendance Chairman when they won't be attending our monthly lunch. For June through September – four months – we had 53 instances where a member did not attend and did not notify Bill Konold. That's 53 lunches, at \$19 each, that were ordered and not eaten, and that our Branch is obligated to pay for nonetheless. To make matters worse, we have been collecting the \$19 cost on less than half of the lunches involved, so we have to make up the difference with money from our annual dues. At the current rate, this is eating up almost 2/3 of our net annual dues collection; if this situation continues, we'll go into the red in 2020.

However, there is a bright side, as we have simple solutions:

If you can't attend the lunch meeting, call Bill no later than the Friday before our Tuesday luncheon - 47 sec-

onds to save \$19, that works out to over \$1400 an hour.

If something happens (you forgot your sister-in-law was coming to visit, or you forgot you'd be fishing in Idaho, or you just plain forgot to call Bill) – please come square on your amount due, because if you don't pay it, the rest of us will have to.

So, please remember. when you know you can't attend, you must contact Bill Konold no later than the Friday before our Tuesday luncheon. The yearly meeting calendar is included in our annual handbook, on our website, and in each monthly newsletter. And you don't have to wait until the Friday before the meeting, just call Bill when you know.

Our next meeting is October 8, and I hope to see you all then, but if you can't make it, please call Bill @ 925 -634-2738.

Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.
