ue, but also in case anyone is in need. Please stay safe and healthy


October birthdays

Here is some information from Harvest Park Bowl.

Harvest Park Bowl Post-COVID League FAQ

Four (4) Person Leagues: One team will bowl on a pair of lanes.

Two-Three (2-3) Person Leagues: Two teams will bowl on a pair of lanes

Oiling the Lanes: Each league will have fresh oil prior to their start.

Leagues with two squads (A and B) will have the lanes reoiled in between Squad A and Squad B.

How do the New Squads (A and B) Work?

Each squad will bowl independent of each other, teams in each squad will only bowl other teams within their respective squad. League standings will reflect the wins/losses, high games, etc like normal.

Are Masks Required when Bowling?

Yes, masks are always required to be worn, upon entering and moving throughout the facility.

Are guests permitted inside the facility when bowling league?

Depending on to be released State and Local Guidelines, regard capacity limits, we are limited to the number of occupants within the facility; thus, we can not permit additional guests inside the facility.

Bowling (*): John Fry

Sirs & Ladies Bowling league happens every Monday @ 9:30 am at Harvest Park Bowl. Our league consists of four-person teams, with approximately 20 teams, and consists of two seasons – a Winter session of 36 weeks and a Summer session of 16 weeks; both are sanctioned with the USBC. We bowl every Monday except for Holidays, and we always have room for more bowlers, seasoned bowlers as well as newcomers. Membership Requirements & Principles *(revised 2019)*

Membership is open to men, regardless of age, race, color, or religion. Member volunteers and staff administer and govern all branch activities. Nominal membership dues help provide for these activities. SIR supports no outside cause or interest. We prohibit discussions of politics and religion or the selling of anything to any member. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.
