#### Activities, Alan Jarvie 408-219-8240

As you know, shelter-in-place has resulted in many of our Branch activities being put on hold. However, the recent availability of vaccines means there is a light at the end of the tunnel, and we've been working on tentative plans for our restart. As soon as we get the okay from the state SIR organization, we'll broadcast an email to the membership, along with activity-specific details.

#### **Poker**

SIR poker is a weekly, low-stakes, 7-player game. We play on Monday evening, 6:30-9:30, with a rotating host. Most recently we've had a pool of 10-12 players, with everyone playing ~7 times over 10-12 weeks.



When we get the green light from the state SIR organization, we'll produce a schedule with a different host and six additional players each week. We should be able to get started within a few weeks of getting that green light.

#### Wine Tasting

We hold our monthly wine tastings on the 4th Thursday @ 5:00pm. Each couple brings a bottle of wine for tasting, and an appetizer to share. The bottles are covered to protect the wine's "identity", each taster scores each wine, and at the end of the evening the scores are totaled and the wines are uncovered.

Re-starting this activity will probably take a little longer than poker. We plan the tastings for 12 couples/24 participants, allowing 24 1-ounce tastings per bottle, so "social distancing" may be a factor, as well as the sharing of food. Once we know when we can have our first tasting, the first step will be to request hosts for each month's tastings.

#### **Bocce**

This is a very informal gathering; Each week we organize teams from whoever shows up. No league, just an opportunity to get some fresh air, some exercise and some relaxation. For the past several years, we have played on Tuesday mornings at 10:00, from mid-March through October.

As a courtesy, the DBCC has allowed us to use their bocce courts at no cost to us, and our continued access will of course depend on any applicable county restrictions.

#### **Beer Tasting**

Until beer tasting went on hiatus in 1999, we held it immediately following our regular lunch meetings, in the lounge adjacent to the main dining room. If there is renewed interest, we will bring it back.

#### **Special Events**

SIR Day at the Races at Golden Gate Fields

Organized by the state SIR organization, as these events are scheduled - usually twice a year, spring and fall - we inform the membership. In the past, we've found that car-pooling was our most cost-effective means of transportation, and we organize that at the Branch.

At present, GGF is open for live racing but horses only, no spectators, with no indication when they expect to get back to normal.

#### Lunch & Bocce at Campo di Bocce

In October 2019 and again in November 2020, we had a group lunch and played bocce at Campo di Bocce. If there is interest, we will continue to organize this event – regulations willing, of course.

Please keep Paul and his family in your thoughts and prayers




# ICE (In Case Of Emergency), Phil Newlin

We go about our daily activities with relative ease and convenience. At any given time though we may encounter an emergency situation at home or away in which we are unable to communicate with those providing help. Under these circumstances, emergency medical and contact information is invaluable to family, friends, and first responders.

There are a number of methods to present this information "In Case of Emergency", or ICE, including bracelets or jewelry, wallet cards, and on your mobile device. Each of these methods have their pros and cons. I use all three methods to cover as many situations as possible.

The bracelets and jewelry are easy to get to, but have limited space for information. Typically, these would be engraved by a retailer and have additional costs when they need updating. Wallet cards provide space for much more information and are free if you make your own, and can be updated easily, but are not as durable unless protected. Retailers can make printed plastic or laminated cards for a fee. Below is an example for a wallet card you can create yourself.

Now, with our mobile devices, there are features that access information quickly and easily. I've provided the steps to setup emergency information for iOS (iPhones) and Android phones. These steps can be downloaded from our web site ( www.sir161.org ) - click the ICE link on the right side of our Home page.




# Message from Jerry Wiebe, Treasurer

# **Membership Requirements & Principles** *(revised 2019)*

Membership is open to men, regardless of age, race, color, or religion. Member volunteers and staff administer and govern all branch activities. Nominal membership dues help provide for these activities. SIR supports no outside cause or interest. We prohibit discussions of politics and religion or the selling of anything to any member. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

## **Attendance Policy** (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.
