As those of you who attended our July SIR luncheon will remember, we initiated an attendee survey to be completed and deposited after the luncheon. Your Branch Executive Committee (BEC) sees this as a first step in



better understanding our members' assessments of our monthly onsite luncheon meetings, and to collect suggestions of how we may improve our meetings to optimize member satisfaction levels and ultimately improve member participation. We intend to continue surveying the group periodically so that we may evaluate our progress in improving our luncheons and identify and track trends and issues that may occur.

The initial survey was designed to evaluate member evaluations of the luncheon venue, food variety, quality, and value, as well as the overall satisfaction with our monthly luncheons. There was also a final openended question asking for any additional comments members wanted to make (good or bad) and to gather suggestions on potential improvements. The following is a high-level summary of preliminary results we gathered, by topic, from this initial survey which had a participation rate of 72%, or 61 of the 85 lunch attendees. Rankings were based on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest, most favorable rating and 1 being the lowest rating.

1) Venue – This area of the results had the highest average rating from our members, receiving an overall score of 4.5 on the 1–5-point scale. Clearly our members appreciate the surroundings of our lunches at the Discovery Bay Golf & Country Club.

2) Food Variety – The average score in this area of the survey came in at 3.3 which indicates members desire a broader range of food items and some offered suggestions that would broaden the list of offerings. We have passed these suggestions on to the club food management team, and they are responding.

3) Food Quality – Although the spread of individual responses was across a broad spectrum ranging from 1 to 5, it appears that the average score of 3.4 indicates that many feel there is room for improvement in the lunches being served.

4) Food Value – This area scored the lowest mean score of the five areas, and I suspect the price increase that took effect at the beginning of this year drove this response down to 3.1 from what it might have been last year. But we should keep in mind *Continued pn page 2...*

this is a result affecting restaurants across the food industry.

5) Overall Satisfaction – The mean score in the overall satisfaction of our membership with our luncheon meetings came in at 3.6. This is an important number that we will continue to watch closely, and our goal will be to get this rating on an upward trend very soon.

I appreciate the input from all the members who responded to our July survey. Please continue to respond to future surveys and we will continue to report the results back to you and our club, as well as act upon your suggestions for changes that will make our monthly meetings more enjoyable to all.

In closing, I would like to congratulate the SIR organization, California's largest social club for active senior men, on the 65th anniversary of its founding in 1958, which occurred on July 23rd.


Assisting him will be Ron Wilson, also a long time member/bowler and past Bowling Director.

Navy and trained to be a nuclear plant operator. He served on the USS Snook for 4 years. During that time he married Donna. He has been married for 53 years.

He used the GI bill to earn BS and MS degrees at the the University of Washington in Metallurgical and Nuclear Engineering. He worked for 7 years at GE Nuclear in San Jose. He then worked for several nuclear power consulting companies and in 1988 helped start Sierra Nuclear in Scotts Valley, CA. The company focused on the design and fabrication of large metal and concrete nuclear fuel storage tanks. Several of the company's Ventilated Storage Casks are in use at U.S. nuclear plants and in Ukraine. The company was sold in 1998 to British Nuclear Fuel Limited. He retired to Discovery Bay in 1998.

He has been a member of the DBCC and the DBYC for over 20 years until they sold their boat several years ago. He has also served on the DBYC Board of Directors as Fleet Captain for two years. His current activities include indoor rowing, nuclear physics, and especially cosmology.



Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.
