


October Mystery Guest Speaker, report by Bob Damico

As our October "Mystery Guest Speaker", Big Sir Ken Landoline gave us a very interesting overview of his experiences as a volunteer at the Orin Allen Youth Rehabilitation Facility, more commonly known as the Byron Boys' Ranch. The Ranch was a low-security correctional facility for wayward young men 12-18 years of age.

Ken explained he was driven to a need to "give back" to the community for the gifts he had received from others earlier in his life. So, from 2006 until 2022 when the Ranch closed, Ken donated his time to the Ranch and the up to one hundred boys living there serving three-to-twelve-month terms.

Ken positively touched hundreds of boys during his 16 years as a weekly volunteer at the Ranch. Not only was he a role model and positive influence on the boys, but it was a rewarding experience for him as well. His quote "It was the most interesting educational experience of my life". In closing, Ken explained that he believed the best thing any of us could do for a person at a low point in their life, such as imprisonment, is to make them understand that others care about them, and they do have a good chance for a positive future. Therefore, his closing slide - "Hope Is the Ultimate Gift" - capped off his very noteworthy presentation.

Thank You Ken for your service to the Boys Ranch and for sharing your story.


During the October luncheon we had one guest, Ken Koodrich (sponsor is Rod Lin).

The last event of the season was a very special activity. The day was perfect. Cool in the morning so we could all show off our SIR Branch 161 vests and warming up as the morning developed. The Reserve in Stockton is the best course we play. It is a great way to celebrate with our Individual Championship. Obviously, this is an individual event that every player has had to qualify to participate. We crown the club champion, award prize money, and put a name on the perpetual trophy based on the lowest net score. Also, recognized are the best golfers with the low gross score.



Chris Diaz posted a gross score of 80 to be awarded an individual trophy. Other top gross scores were achieved by Dan Lippstreu and David Vicencio with 85s. Way to go guys!

Congratulations are in order for Randy Zierau with the best low net score of 66. His name will be returning to the perpetual trophy, as this is not the first time he has won this tournament. He also receives an individual trophy. Dan Lippstreu had a close 69 and Chris Diaz scored a net 70. Johnny Welton and Ken Fanucchi both had 73s. Many other prizes were awarded as is the club's tradition.

This season we have had 47 players participate in at least one event. Thirty-six (77%) players have won some money! The leading money winner for 2023 is Dan Lippstreu with \$276. Johnny Welton followed with \$267. Chris Diaz won \$230. Randy Zierau earned \$186 followed by Sid Cruser at \$176. Ken Fanucchi, Ed Fitzpatrick, Mike Carmichael, Bill Konold, John Sutton, Vince Vargas, and David Vicencio round out the top twelve. It really does pay to play golf!

The Season Long Leaders Contest has also ended. When we started it wasn't clear that we had identified two separate games, but the outcome was very clear. There were ten teams of two that registered. Players used their scores from each event during the season. They didn't need to play together but their scores were combined for this special competition.

Contest 1: Event Leaders: Used the total net team score (both players not best ball). Points were awarded based on team placement in each event. Awards were based on rank order of the total team points (high to low).

Ed Fitzpatrick/Dan Lippstreu had a total of 100 points to win \$90. Johnny Welton/Dennis Pachucki scored 90 points with Randy Zierau/Johnny Welton earning 79. Two teams tied for fourth place with 66 points: Tom Denning/Lee Donnell and Chris Diaz/Sid Cruser.

Contest 2: Best Ball Leaders: The team net best ball total in each event (one player's net score used each hole). Team scores for all events were averaged based on the number of events played. Awards were based on the rank order of average team scores (low to high). Chris Diaz/Sid Cruser averaged a low score of 62.8 to also earn and share \$90. Randy Zierau/Welton averaged 65.0 and Ed Fitzpatrick/Dan Lippstreu scored 65.4. Bill Konold/Mike Carmichael were the fourth team with 66.1.

Now the as the golf season winds down, thoughts turn to planning events for next year, NCGA membership, and recruiting new golfers. I hope you will consider joining us. We have a great time!

This Sir satisfies his need for speed, report by Ron Wilson

Congratulations to our fellow Sir Carl Carlson for his championship win in 2023 NHRA Hot Rod Heritage Series!



Carl owns and drives a beautiful "Nostalgia Eliminator 3" roadster and races in the 9.600 second index class. For those who do not know what index Racing is, here is a simple explanation. When racing, Carl must get his car from the start line to the finish (1/4 mile) as close to 9.600 seconds as possible without going quicker than 9.600 seconds. if he does go under the 9.600 he basically loses that race. We are not talking seconds here as his closest win was 0.002 seconds and his closest loss was 0.0008 seconds. Obviously the car must be tuned perfectly and the driver has to be spot on. His speed is in the 138 mph area at the finish line even though his car is capable of 150 mph. Horsepower for this class is in the 600-800 range. Tuning for achieving his 9.600 second target is demanding. He has to achieve the perfect air/fuel flow, perfect engine timing, precise tire pressure, add or subtract weight to the car and has to closely monitor atmospheric temperature, barometric pressure and humidity which all impact the tuneup. Then Carl has to nail the starting light (Tree) and drive the car perfectly.

Again, congratulations to Carl for his hard earned and well deserved championship season.

Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).
