In 2023 our Branch recruited 12 new members. The branch currently offers eleven activities, eight of which are coed. I expect the branch to continue actively recruiting new members, but challenges will continue given the median age demographic, which rose slightly from 79.8 to 80.4. Given the current median age trend, it is imperative to continue bringing guests for luncheons and exposing them to the wide range of activities available if they join.



One bright spot in 2023 is that our monthly luncheons continue to draw over 60 % participation rate, and if we include inactive members it exceeds 70%. The branch sponsored 12 guests in 2023. At the January luncheon we had three guests, all recruited by Dennis Pachucki. Their names are: Rick Wilson, Jim Sniadecki, and Joel Riggs.

Last year one branch member recruited the most members and thus Jim Wangeman, our new Big Sir, is our branch's top recruiter, and will receive an additional free meal certificate for his efforts.

Members are encouraged to pay for multiple events at one time. For 2024 members may pay \$540 for all nine events or pay \$480 for eight events if paid before the luncheon on February 13. The fee is \$65 per event if paid otherwise. The Drop Out/Refund policy shall be in effect.

Participation

Please do whatever you can to increase our numbers playing in each event. A core group of 26 players (playing in 5 or more events) gave us 19-29 players per event last year. 42 different players played last year. We must have 24 players at each event this year at the price we are charging. We currently have 28-32 spots at each event. We need everyone to recruit players (SIR members, guests, etc.) that will sign up for every event. The best way to keep the price down is to have more participants. Two courses required a minimum number of players to allow us to schedule an event. All nine courses increased their rates this year. If you have ideas to increase our numbers, please let me know. If you have names that you want us to add to our email distribution, send me their email. We don't want anyone to miss out on the fun!

We also just completed the Napa Tournament and there were 82 bowlers from various branches. The Napa tournament results for our branch members are as follows. The Napa tournament was a first for most bowlers as Napa is 100% String Setters (new technology). There are some subtle differences in pinfall but overall better than we expected. The United States Bowling Congress (USBC) conducted exhaustive testing over about four months and has declared no significant difference in averages compared to our older mechanical pin setters. We will be seeing more of this new technology at our bowling venues since there is much less maintenance expense for the venue owners.

We also have two vacancies in our winter league and would welcome any new bowlers to fill these vacancies. We bowl Monday mornings from 10:00 to approximately 12:45 at Bowlero in Brentwood. We are a handicap scoring league, so new or low average bowlers do not hurt a team. Our league consists of SIR men and spouses or significant others. It is a very social atmosphere and we have a lot of fun. Our league bowls 34 weeks for the winter season and 17 weeks for the summer season.

Membership Requirements & Principles

(revised 2019)

Membership is open to men, regardless of age, race, color, or religion. Member volunteers and staff administer and govern all branch activities. Nominal membership dues help provide for these activities. SIR supports no outside cause or interest. We prohibit discussions of politics and religion or the selling of anything to any member. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy (Revised July, 2012)

Luncheon meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Discovery Bay Country Club, 1475 Club House Drive. (There are exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you may be charged for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.

Certification of attendance at another branch will be considered a credit to attendance.
