## October Guest Speaker

Mike McCaffrey is a lifelong cowboy and an ardent animal welfare advocate who has lived on a small ranch in downtown Byron for 35 years (FACT - he can throw a rock and hit the Byron Post Office from his corral). Mike is a retired City of Hayward fireman (32 years), retiring as a Battalion Chief. Upon retiring, he saw a need for an organization to contain horses and other types of large livestock during times of natural disasters, such as fires, earthquakes windstorms, floods, etc. Out of this concept came "Hold Your Horses, Evacuation and Rescue (HYH)". HYH is deployed to a command post by Cal Fire, CoCo County Fire, and The Office of County Emergency Services where they set up their camp. Their duties then include coordination with all the other agencies, rescue and round-up, transportation of animals, staging and sheltering, and feeding/animal welfare (need for veterinarians?) until the crisis clears, and the owners can return to their ranches, farms and homes.

There are special rules for championship competition that require players to play in five events or have registered and paid for five events in the current season to be eligible for the perpetual trophy. Others may play in the event but will not be eligible for the championship competition or tee prizes.

- 1. The name of the low net winner will be placed on the perpetual trophy for the SIR Branch 161 Golf Championship Tournament. The winner may retain the perpetual trophy for eight months and then return the trophy to the Director of Golf.
- The low net winner will also receive an individual trophy.
- 3. The low gross winner (who is not the low net winner) will receive an individual trophy.

4. The player to win the most money during the golf season will receive recognition as the "Sand Bagger" for the year with a trophy as "Top Money Winner" and a t-shirt.

In addition, there will be surprise tee prizes for those eligible and treats for everyone.
