

Golf News, Johnny Welton

It was a very nice day at Franklin Canyon Golf Course, and 34 players had a great time! We had the most players ever for a SIR event thanks to Bill Konold and the Rough Riders group joining us. We started with doughnuts, enjoyed treat bags, and played a hard course mostly in the sun. The Shamble format allowed everyone to use the longest drive from their team on each hole. Counting all four scores for the team created some interesting results and some great scores!

I had the best net score on the day with a 74. I think the best SIR golf day for me ever! Net 76's were reported by Albert Delgado, Rick Maniz, Bill Konold, and Mike Kaufman. Eleven players in all were in the net 70's. Bill Konold and Rick Maniz had low gross scores of 86. I had an 87. Joe Stanley had an 88. David Vicencio, Tom Denning, and Sid Cruser all had 89s. There were some great individual scores.

There were no individual contests, but prizes were awarded to the first four teams. First place went to Johnny Welton, Alberto Delgado, Dennis Pachucki and Rick Maniz (304) by 16 strokes. All four players were in the net 70's. Second place: David Vicencio, Todd Ramsdell, John Emerson, and Bill Konold (320). Third Place: Mike Kaufman, Joe Riggs, Rick Martin and Blind Draw Bob Rodrique (325). Fourth Place: Tom Denning, Sid Cruser, Isao Nishijima, and Blind Draw Ken Fanucchi.

2025 has been a banner season for SIR Branch 161 Golf. This season we have had our highest number of participants (254). Participation was up from 44 to 56 players. 44 were SIR members. 19 were new to golf. 21 played seven times or more. The average event had 25.4 players with a range of 16-35 players. \$1,914 were distributed in prize money. 82.1% of the players went home winners.

The NCGA membership renewal for 2026 begins now. Anyone can join through the SIR Branch 161 Golf. The cost is \$48. See the promotion included in this newsletter. Checks should be sent in before January 1, 2026. There are lots of benefits to SIR Golf and NCGA membership.



Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member.

Attendance Policy

Until further notice, luncheon meetings will be held on the first Tuesday of the month at Club Los Meganos at Trilogy in Brentwood. (There may exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion. If you cannot attend, you are required to notify the Attendance Chairman by the Friday prior to the luncheon meeting or you will be assessed a fee for the luncheon.

Regular members missing three consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, or missing more than five (5) meetings within the last 12 months for any reason (not counting May and December), will have their membership reviewed by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and may receive a notice from the BEC of their decision to consider terminating the absent Sir's membership.
