I, along with Little Sir Dave Ciruli and Treasurer Skip Zehnder, recently attended the annual State SIR Meeting in Lafayette. Some interesting highlights worth mentioning :



1. SIR has added a new Branch in San Diego, the first since 2020 (Covid). This is a BIG DEAL in moving forward. SIR now has 78 Branches (76 all men and 2 co-ed), scattered all over the State.

2. Presently there are 8,599 members statewide.

3. An average of 110 members per Branch . We (Branch 161) presently have 115 members.

4. After 25 years of steady, downward decline in membership, State SIR is noticing a bottoming out of the downward spiral. A low plateau is beginning to appear as a result of Branch "Marketing Campaigns" in 2025 and 2026 . We have only lost a net 181 members statewide in the last 8 1/2 months It appears that we are starting to stem the outgoing tide.

2020: 11,950 (- 7,161)

2025: 8,780 (- 3,170). Start of Marketing Campaigns.

2026 to date: 8599 (-181). A major slowdown is appearing.

5. The State now lists:

29 Branches as GROWING.

31 Branches as SIGNIFICANTLY Declining.

Our Branch 161 Marketing Campaign is showing promise; let's keep moving forward. We presently have 62 members hailing from Discovery Bay, 46 from Brentwood, 2 from Byron, and 1 each from Antioch, Concord, and Rio Vista. We need to concentrate on these areas for gaining new members; Signage (posters, flyers etc.) may be the answer for becoming better known in these parts. Keep up your good work.

Our 35-week winter league began on September 14th with eleven 4-person teams.



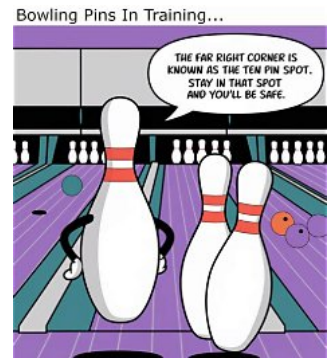
Upcoming SIR Tournaments:

SIR Golf has had a record-breaking year with more players than ever before (206 to date). Thirty-two players competed at Blue Rock Springs West Golf Course this month. It ties our largest group ever! This year has seen more players overall at every event. This ties a record!



It was a beautiful day that found the course in great shape and play was consistent but challenging. The day overall went to Lee Donnell with total winnings of \$33. In Flight A Lee and Terry Dawkins tied for low gross scores of 84. Lee won the tie breaker on hole 18. Lee also won two skins and was closest to the hole on #15 with 1' 2". Rick Maniz also had a great day earning \$29 including 3 skins. Randy Zierau won \$26. Joe Riggs will collect \$24 including closest to the hole on #3 at 8' 2".

Membership Requirements & Principles

Attendance Policy

Luncheon meetings are held on the first Tuesday of the month at Club Los Meganos at Trilogy in Brentwood. (There may be exceptions when we need to hold our meetings on a different Tuesday, so please check the Meetings Calendar elsewhere in this newsletter).

Social hour is at 11.00am and lunch is at noon. All members are expected to attend Luncheon meetings unless prevented by illness, absence from the Branch locale, or acting as a caregiver to a spouse or companion.
